

Sister Rose Assumpta Rossi – 70 years

Born in Poughkeepsie, N.Y., Sister Rose Assumpta entered the Sisters of Saint Francis in 1940 and professed her perpetual vows July 14, 1946 at Mt Hope N.Y. She received both her BS and MA from Fordham University in NYC. Her years in ministry were spent teaching in various schools in the New York area. She taught grade school at St. Aloysius School, Mt. Loretto on Staten Island from 1946 to 1954; Immaculate Conception, Tuckahoe from 1954 to 1957 and again from 1963 to 1980. She also taught at St. Catherine's, Pelham from 1954 to 1957 and at Annunciation School, Crestwood, NY from 1981 to 1997. Following this, she continued in the ministry of teaching with a focus on remedial reading and math. In 1995 she was honored at her alma mater, Fordham University for her dedication and ability in teaching students. Sister Rose Assumpta is now retired and living at Immaculate Conception Convent in Hastings-on-Hudson
