



Sister Mary Agnes Frawley

Sister Mary Agnes Frawley was a very gentle woman who was known for reaching out to others in her quiet way and never wanting to hurt anyone. This unassuming woman spent her life in being of service to many. With the heart of a missionary she reached out to the poor of Buffalo in her ministry at the Little Portion Friary, the St. Vincent de Paul Dining Room, Catholic Charities Outreach and in home care to shut-ins. For 19 years she taught elementary school in Buffalo as well as Texas and Florida.

Mary Agnes was born in Rochester, N.Y. to Edward and Estelle Frawley. She grew up in the Spencerport and Rochester area and worked at the Rochester Telephone Company before she entered the Franciscan Missionary Sisters of the Divine Child in 1951. In 2003 she became a Sister of St. Francis of the Third Order Regular of Buffalo and was part of the union of the Buffalo, Hastings-on-Hudson and Syracuse congregations.
